## Sticky Knowledge

When we look at maps, north is usually at the top.

Maps have different scales. This depends on how much land we want to look at.

The Earth can be divided into Northern and Southern hemispheres. They are divided by a line at the equator.

The earth can be divided into Western and Eastern Hemispheres. They are divided by the Greenwich Meridian.

The Greenwich Meridian is an imaginary line that runs north to south. The Equator is an imaginary line that runs west to east.
