| 3 | Bill Hook bouncing off | Group + Leaders | Tool maintenance – kept sharp and useable. No gloves worn when using. | 4 | 3 | 12 | To ensure the group have a full understanding on how to position the tool correctly when using to reduce the likelihood of a bounce occurring and ensuring no contacts with any member of the group. | SEO AND MH |
| 4 | Bill Hook blade snapping | Group + Leaders | Regular and effective maintenance of tools. | 1 | 3 | 3 | The group should know that if a problem has occurred with a tool it should be reported immediately to SEO AND MH and/or another adult to report to SEO AND MH. The leader will decommission the tool. | SEO AND MH |
